DAY 4

*Read:* Genesis 41:39-40

How can you be trusted at school or in your community? To help your team, you have the responsibility of attending soccer practices. To get good grades, you have the responsibility of completing your homework in time. Have you become someone who can be trusted?

Trace an outline of your hand. Print the word God across the palm. List five responsibilities you have at school or at church, one on each finger. Use this as a reminder that when you trust God, you become someone who can be trusted to be responsible.

DAY 1

*Read:* Genesis 7:1-5

God wants you to trust Him and to become someone who can be trusted. Did Noah trust God? Yes! Did God trust Noah to be responsible? Yes! Being responsible means proving you can be trusted with what is expected of you. As you trust God and follow Him, you become responsible and someone who can be trusted.



Look at yourself in your mirror. Does your family expect you to do chores? Homework? Look after a pet? With a parent's permission, use a washable marker to list these expectations on the mirror. At the end of the week, erase areas in which you were responsible this week.

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DAY 2

Read: Psalm 56:11

People can let you down, but God can always be trusted. You can trust God to love you unconditionally. You can trust God to keep His promises. How can trusting God help you become someone who can be trusted? You can trust God to help you be more like Him.

Lay a penny, a nickel, a dime, and a quarter "heads up." Make a rubbing of each coin on a sheet of blank paper. Fill in the blanks below with the four words each coin has in common. The next time you pick up a coin, remember that you can trust God.

DAY 3

Read: 1 Samuel 17:34-35

David was expected to take care of his father's sheep. Can you be trusted at home with what is expected of you? Do you need to be reminded to do your chores or homework? Responsibility involves being trusted to do what is expected of you without having to be reminded.

**Pray daily, asking God to help you complete your responsibilities each day. Set a timer, alarm clock, or cell phone to ring at an appropriate time every day for you to complete your chores.**
